

FINAL RITES MONDAY FOR MRS. GARVIN

Mrs. John Garvin of Santa Monica, California and a former resident of Wenona, succumbed in St. Mary's hospital, Streator at 12:30 p. m. Friday, November 18. She had been a patient in the hospital since suffering a stroke November 6th, in the home of Mrs. Maxine Tomlinson. Mr. and Mrs. Garvin had arrived in Wenona about two weeks previous to look after farm interests and visit friends.

The body was brought to the Thierry Funeral Home, where many friends and relatives called to pay their last respects.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock in St. John's Methodist church, of which the deceased
