## Sudden Death of Mrs. Lois Morrison Friday Night

Mrs. Lois (Garvin) Morrison, 59, died suddenly about 8:30 o'clock Friday night in the home of her father, John Garvin, with whom she had been residing. Mr. Garvin found his daughter dead when he arrived home about midnight from a card party in the home of friends. Death was caused by a cerebral hemorrhage.
